Oro Valley is located in the beautiful Sonoran Desert, about three miles north of the Tucson city limits. Nestled between the Catalina and Tortolita mountain ranges, this 35-square-mile town is surrounded by dramatic views and wide open spaces. Oro Valley sits at an elevation of 2,620 feet and enjoys one of the sunniest, most comfortable climates in the country. Year-round temperatures average highs of 83 and lows of 54 degrees. With a variety of quality housing options and status as one of the safest communities in Arizona, the quality of life in Oro Valley is second to none.

Love arts and culture? Catch a live concert at historic Steam Pump Ranch, or check out our collection of more than 200 pieces of public art spread throughout town.

Interested in education? Oro Valley is home to nationally ranked schools and just 13 miles from the University of Arizona, and 4.8 miles from the Pima Community College Northwest Campus.

Craving outdoor adventure? Our recreation comes with stunning views. Whether you're a walker, runner, hiker, skater, cyclist, horseback rider or mountain biker, you can find your path here with nearly 60 miles of shared use paths throughout the town. Oro Valley is the gateway to beautiful Catalina State Park, and we're even connected to the Chuck Huckelberry Loop, named USA Today's "Best Recreational Trail" in America in 2021 and 2022. Oro Valley is a year-round outdoor sports mecca, and in winter, our proximity to Mount Lemmon means the ski slopes are just 60 minutes away.

Oro Valley has a dynamic trail system, including 22 miles of paved multi-use pathways along major streets, which allow recreational users and commuters to safely reach schools, employment and shopping without encountering vehicle traffic. The Town also has 44 miles of natural trails for hiking and mountain biking.


The Cañada del Oro Linear Park, located along the Cañada del Oro Wash, features a paved path and native landscaping, from La Cañada Drive to Steam Pump Village, a distance of 3.5 miles one way. From this core section, users can access Catalina State Park, Big Wash Linear Park and the Chuck Huckelberry Loop, a paved, 137-mile urban trail system. The Loop provides easy access to restaurants, retail and historic Steam Pump Ranch.

Cycling

Oro Valley has been at the forefront of establishing bicycle facilities along its roadways over the last decade, adding to the region's reputation as a premiere training location for both bicyclists and multi-sport athletes. There are 78.89 miles of bicycle facilities within the Town, including 33.47 miles of signed bike routes, 24.4 miles of paved shoulders, and 30.2 miles of shared use paths. In addition, all new commercial facilities within the Town are required to have bicycle parking, as per the Town's Zoning Code.

Mountain biking

Thrill seekers and mountain biking enthusiasts will find their bliss in Oro Valley. Check out the Honeybee Canyon Loop, which was ranked among the best trails in southern Arizona by *Bike Arizona*. This loop trail is a 17-mile, single-track trail that is rated easy to intermediate.





Catalina State Park

Oro Valley is the gateway to beautiful Catalina State Park, a 5,493-acre park on the western slopes of the Santa Catalina Mountains. Tent and RV campgrounds let you get away from it all while having modern conveniences just minutes away. Hike, horseback ride or bicycle on a variety of trails, rated "easy" through "difficult." Don't miss the easy Romero Ruins trail (hikers only), which will lead you to an archaeological site from 500 AD.

Recreation in Oro Valley

Swimming pools

The **Oro Valley Aquatic Center** is located within **James D. Kriegh Park**, 23 W. Calle Concordia. The facility, which is open year-round, features two heated pools: a 50-meter, Olympic-sized competition pool and 25-yard recreation pool. It also includes an interactive splash pad, a giant water slide, diving boards and space for parties and meetings. Oro Valley also has a lap pool that accommodates aquaaerobic classes at the **Oro Valley Community and Recreation Center**, 10555 N. La Cañada Drive.

Golf

Oro Valley is home to **El Conquistador Golf at the Oro Valley Community and Recreation Center**, which offers two 18-hole courses onsite and the scenic 9-hole **Pusch Ridge Golf Course** near the Hilton Resort. All three championship golf courses were designed by Greg Nash. **The Views Golf Club** also welcomes public play.

Dog parks

Oro Valley has two off-leash dog park locations. The **James D. Kriegh Park** location has a single area where dogs of all sizes can play together. The **Naranja Park** location has three separate spaces for small dogs, large dogs and vulnerable dogs. The double-gated fenced parks also contain picnic tables, shaded ramadas and paved paths.

Parks

The Town of Oro Valley has five recreational parks within its boundaries. **James D. Kriegh Park (JDK)**, is a 20-acre park with racquetball courts, a dog park, baseball and softball fields and the **Oro Valley Aquatic Center**. **Cañada del Oro Riverfront Park** is 30 acres with a playground, tennis court, pickleball courts, basketball court, softball and soccer fields and a lighted walking path. **West Lambert Lane Park** spans 40-acres and features natural trails and interpretive signage. **Naranja Park** is the largest park at 213 acres. It contains a pump track, skate park, two pickleball courts, a splash pad, archery range, three off-leash dog parks, six multi-purpose fields, a playground with a zip line, and more than three miles of hiking trails. **Honey Bee Canyon Park** has two ramadas and a three-mile trail system that winds through the Sonoran Desert.

Community Center, tennis and pickleball

The **Oro Valley & Recreation Community Center** offers a number of activities and amenities, including: a fitness center with strength and cardio equipment, classes for all ages such as yoga, tai chi and painting, an indoor racquetball court, an indoor game room, 10 lighted pickleball courts and a lap pool. Oro Valley has a strong tennis community. Fifteen lighted tennis courts are available for play and an additional 16 lighted courts are available at the **Pusch Ridge Tennis Facility** location, 10000 N. Oracle Rd. The Community Center is also home to two 18-hole golf courses, a golf shop and restaurant/bar.





Quality housing options

Oro Valley has a diverse offering of housing options to meet the needs of its residents. Not only are Oro Valley neighborhoods close to shopping centers, schools and churches, they also provide the closeness and "small town feel" that residents desire. You'll enjoy getting to know your neighbors, attending local community events, and easy access to parks, trails and neighborhood playgrounds.

Oro Valley neighborhoods are safe neighborhoods thanks to an outstanding police department (see Public Safety on page 7) and active Neighborhood Watch programs. Our streets are wide, clean and smooth.

University of Arizona

University of Arizona is a premier, public research university with nearly 43,500 students, more than 150 majors and 21 colleges. In fact, the newest addition to their college offerings is the University of Arizona College of Veterinary Medicine, which is located right here in Oro Valley. According to the National Science Foundation, UArizona is in the top 20 public research universities. The Arizona Wildcats teams compete in the Big 12 conference.

Pima Community College

With more than 25,000 students, five campuses, four education centers and three adult education learning centers, Pima Comunity College provides traditional and online instruction for approximately 150 transfer and occupational programs. The college also offers workforce training, non-credit personal interest classes and post-baccalaureate certificates.

Key services include orthopedics, inpatient rehabilitation, cardiology, minimally invasive surgery, gastroenterology, cardiopulmonary testing, imaging and diagnostics, emergency medicine, and an adult behavioral health unit.



Pay a visit to historic Steam Pump Ranch, established by George Pusch more than 100 years ago as a place to water cattle being driven to the railroad in Tucson. The ranch, listed on the National Register of Historic Places, has become a community gathering place for events, live music and a farmers market every Saturday.
